Sixth Sunday of Easter May 5, 2024

As We Gather

The hymn text "Abide with Me," by English clergyman Henry Lyte, has a history that assists in making the words of hope and comfort in the text memorable. Yet, in reflecting on the true importance of the hymn, it is not the circumstances surrounding why it was written that gives it beauty but the words themselves that the author wrote. In timeless poetry, Lyte underscores the meaning of God's presence in the life of the Christian as he writes: "I fear no foe with Thee at hand to bless" (LSB 878:5). Our Lord abides with us not only at eventide, but at all times and in all places. Here and now let us bring to this caring God our thanks and praise!

At Redemption, we celebrate the Lord's Supper in the confession that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but also his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins. This also strengthens our union with him and with one another. We invite to His table those who trust his words and repent of all sin. Any who hold a confession differing from this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, are asked to speak with Pastor Josh or an Elder (1 Cor. 11:17-24).
